Henley Golf & Country Club - Local Rules

1. OUT OF BOUNDS (rule 27-1)

- (a) Beyond any hedges, ditches or white stakes defining the boundary of the course.
- (b) Practice ground.
- (c) 10th fairway FROM 18th tee.
- (d) Wild flower area between 11th and 18th holes. **NB. BALLS MUST NOT BE RETRIEVED FROM THIS AREA.**

2. WATER HAZARDS (rule 26) All areas defined by yellow stakes.

LATERAL WATER HAZARDS (rule 26)

All areas defined by red stakes.

The lake behind 4th green plays as lateral water hazard and relief must be taken in the dropping zone to the left of the lake.

3. TREES (rule 24-2)

Relief can only be taken from **STAKED** trees and trees that have a **CLEAR PLASTIC COATING - COLOURED PLASTIC COATING** or **BAMBOO CANES AROUND A TREE DO NOT CONSTITUTE A STAKE**

4. EMBEDDED BALL (rule 25-2)

Through the green, a ball that is embedded in its own pitch-mark in the ground, other than sand, may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as possible to where it lay but not nearer the hole. A player may not obtain relief under this local rule if it is clearly unreasonable for him to make a stroke because of interference by anything other than the condition covered by this local rule.

5. GROUND UNDER REPAIR (rule 25)

- (a) Areas marked GUR - relief must be taken (rule 25-b(i)).
- (b) All prepared flower/shrub areas - relief must be taken (this does NOT include gorse and other bushes in the rough where the ball must be played as it lies or relief taken under penalty of 1 stroke).
- (c) Tyre ruts 'through the green'.
- (d) The wildflower area at the side of the 2nd green where the dropping zone must be used.

6. STONES IN BUNKERS Stones in bunkers are movable obstructions (rule 24-1 applies).

7. FIXED SPRINKLER HEADS

All fixed sprinkler heads are immovable obstructions and relief from interference by them may be obtained under rule 24-2. In addition, if a ball lies off the putting green, and a sprinkler head within 2 club lengths of the putting green and within 2 club lengths of the ball intervenes on the line of play between the ball and the hole, the player may take relief by lifting and dropping the ball at the nearest point to where the ball lay that is not nearer the hole, avoids intervention and is not in a hazard or on the putting green.

8. PATHS All pathways are not in play, relief may be taken under rule 24-2b.
